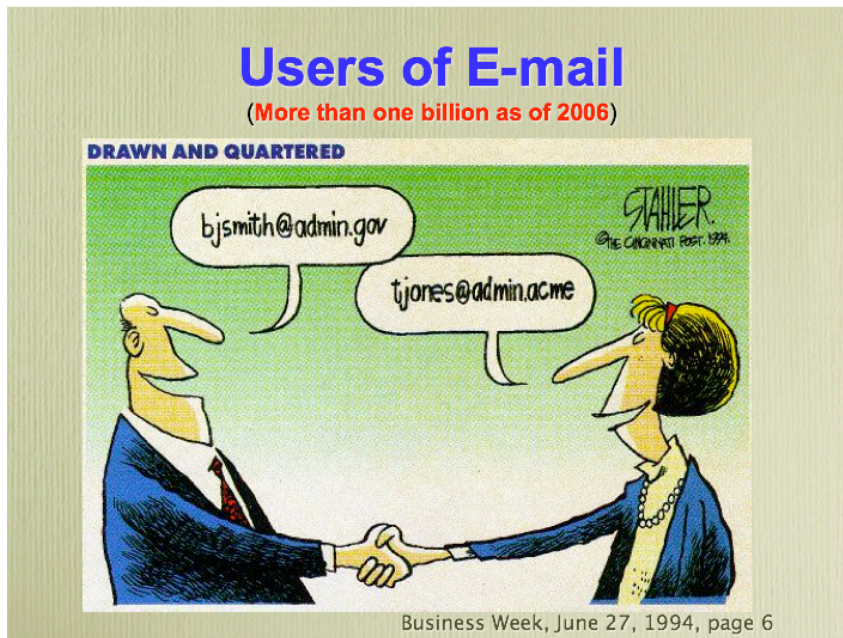

II. About Globally Collaborative Environmental Peace Gaming (GCEPG):

Prof. Bob Noel (see Item (6)-(a) above) then conducted an international crisis gaming in normative mode. He assigned several schools to act as if the governments of Soviet Union, France, Germany, England, China, the US, Canada, Japan, etc., etc. Students had to study backgrounds of the assigned countries. Once the gaming started, they exchanged diplomatic messages as if they were acting as prime minister, ministers of foreign affairs, defense, etc., etc. The scenario was to assume that there were border incidents between Iraq and Iran (which really happened about 8 years later). Japanese team sent their msg to the UN asking to internationalize Maraca Strait to secure oil flow from the middle eastern countries, and so on. Students were really excited, since such (almost) instant communication exchange through ARPANET (the predecessor of current

Internet) and GE's time-sharing system, etc., at very low cost was unimaginable at that time.

Professor Jonathan Wilkenfeld of the University of Maryland was a graduate student under Prof. Bob Noel at the University of California in Santa Barbara. He later established the Center for International Development and Conflict Management (CIDCM) as extending what we did.

I wanted to combine this normative gaming with exchange of "qualitative" words together with "facts and figures" approach of "quantitative" simulation — preferably using System Dynamics to indicate the interrelatedness and interdependencies of various social factors and world politics/phenomenon — see;

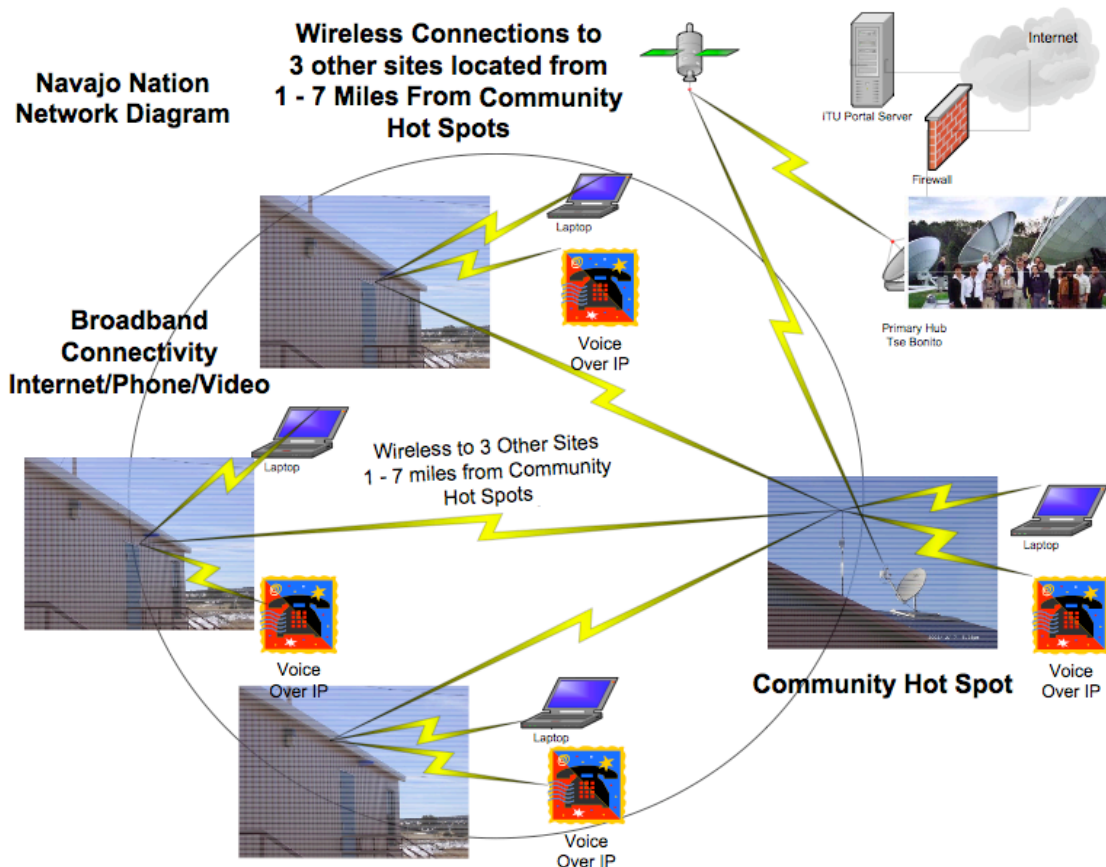

ATTACHMENT II

Brief on Globally Collaborative Environmental Peace Gaming (GCEPG) Project

1. Project Description:

GCEPG with a globally distributed computer simulation system will focus on the issue of socio-economic-environment and sustainable development in Japan, the US, China, Russia, and the other relevant countries. Researchers in those countries will construct their simulation models, which will be interconnected through broadband Internet to form Globally Distributed Socio-Economic-Environmental Simulation System.

The initial focus will be on the quantitative policy analysis of global interrelations and interdependencies among those countries with the deployment of gas pipeline from Tomsk, Siberia to China, and the construction of hydroelectric dam in the Republic of Altai, Siberia where there are five UNESCO World Heritage sites which draw increasing number of tourists into small town of Gorno-Altai with only 9,000 residents. This gas pipeline will certainly affect socio-economic developments of China, and hence the ones of Japan, the US, Europe and others.

This project will then demonstrate integrated and synergistic approach among grassroots, government, university, stakeholder, etc. Use of graphic info modeling/mapping and potentially "gaming" on key issues and potential solutions will assist each group's ability for standardized data gathering and situational analyses, projecting out potential outcomes for more informed decision making and activities. It brings together most sophisticated university-based mathematical modeling techniques and experts and regular people who can then more easily see--at a glance--how issues and outcomes can impact and interact each other.

This project will train local experts for leadership development, in relation to strategic use of technologies and cooperation among stakeholders for more effective advocacy, informed policy, public understanding and participation and concrete community

development.

2. Project Objective:

GCEPG will construct Globally Distributed Socio-Economic-Environmental Simulation System through broadband Internet, which will have two tier system:

- (a) One for training young would-be decision makers in crisis management, conflict resolution, and negotiation techniques basing on "facts and figures" and
- (b) The other for helping decision makers construct a globally distributed decision-support system for positive sum/win-win alternatives to conflict and war.
