Prof. Ajayi then kindly introduced us to Dr. Turner Isoun, then the Minister of Science and Technology (who came out from your university), in Dr. Isoun's office, which mtg was videotaped and broadcasted nationally.

By the kind arrangement of Prof. Ajayi, Charles and I (and another NITDA person) visited your university to meet with Vice Chancellor, Professor Simeon Chituru Achinewhu in his office — after visiting universities of Jose, Ife, Futo and Abia State University Teaching Hospital.

Therefore, as recalling those days, I was very delighted to receive your msg.

(3) Since then, Charles has been spearheading to create GUS/Nigeria with his tenacity.

Should you be interested, you may consider to have your university act as the secretariat of the GUS/Nigeria consortium of higher educational and healthcare institutions — initially in your state or region, and later to expand to include other states in Nigeria.

(4) We prefer to work with people in country-wise rather than region-wise, since our aim is to have broadband Internet (preferably via optical fiber) connecting those institutions. This would require a large amount of fund, and we attempt to get it from the Japanese government's Official Development Assistance (ODA) fund, which goes through only governmental channels.

This project will be centered at the Polytechnic University (my alma mater) in Brooklyn - see the MOU mentioned in the above. As said in it, President Hultin of the Polytechnic University is a friend of President Clinton and was a classmate at the Yale University Law School, and the former Under Secretary of the US Navy. As said in it, he conducted several war gaming for terrorists attack, and thereby, he is very much interested in our peace gaming project, which term I coined almost three decades ago. BTW, war gaming is to win the war once when it happened, and peace gaming is to avoid the occurrence of war. President Hultin said to me that avoiding war is cheaper than waging war.

(7) You are at the center of Niger Delta which is the largest crude oil producing location in Africa and is one of major oil exporters to the US and elsewhere.

(8) The reasons why I chose Polytechnic University for my Ph. D., was to study the design of petroleum refinery and petrochemical plant, since its chemical engineering department offered the best in the US almost a half century ago.

I pioneered there the use of analog computer for the analysis of chemical reaction. After graduating there, I worked at Shell Chemical (which was a subsidiary of Royal-Dutch Shell Oil) and Mobil Oil to use analog, digital and hybrid computers for the simulation of process control of chemical plants, analysis of extracting shale oil out of shale rock from Rocky Mountains (which reserve is equivalent to Saudi's), and then on the design of many, many ethylene plants (almost 75% of them in Japan) -- each plant costing almost \$ one billion -- at Stone & Webster Engineering in Boston.

Subsequently, I am wondering if your university might be interested in becoming the African center of those courses on oil production, refinery and petrochemical engineering as emulating the Polytechnic University.
